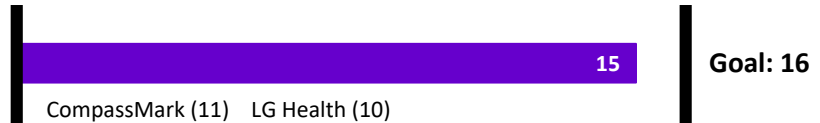


**Goal 1: Strengthen evidence-based prevention and interventions**

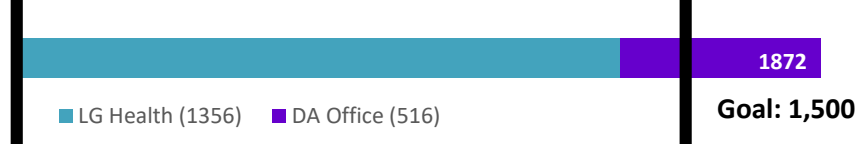
1.1 Increase the number of school districts offering an evidence-based prevention program from 13 to 16.



1.2 Increase the number of drop-off sites for unused medications from 29 to 31.

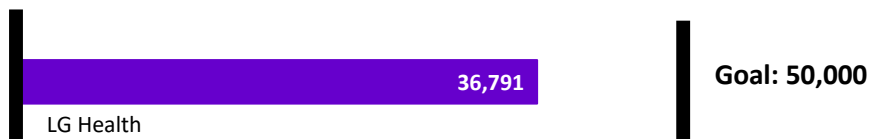


1.3 Distribute 1,500 naloxone kits to first responders, pharmacies, primary care, and community organizations.

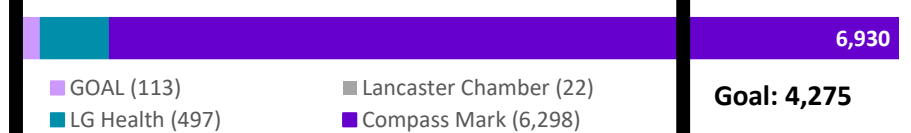


**Goal 2: Continue to share common messages throughout the community**

2.3 Exceed 6,000,000 media/website impressions through the countywide media campaign.

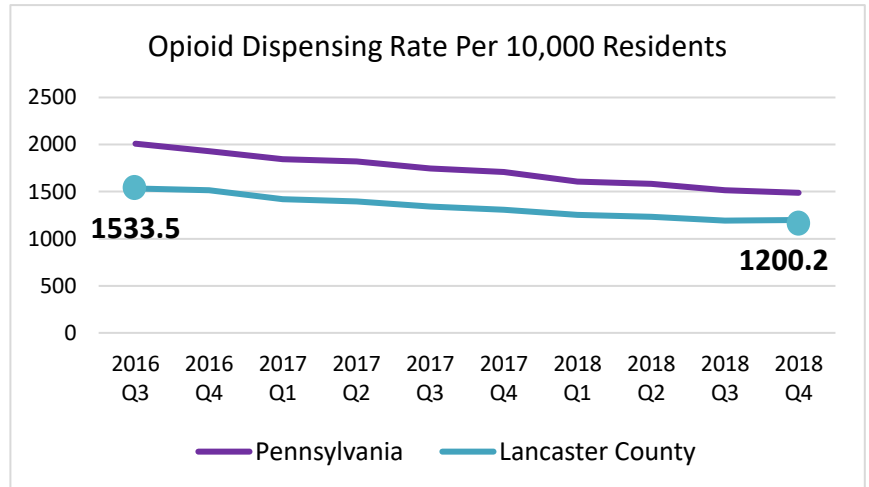


2.4 Exceed 1,500 new visitors to the Joining Forces website each quarter.



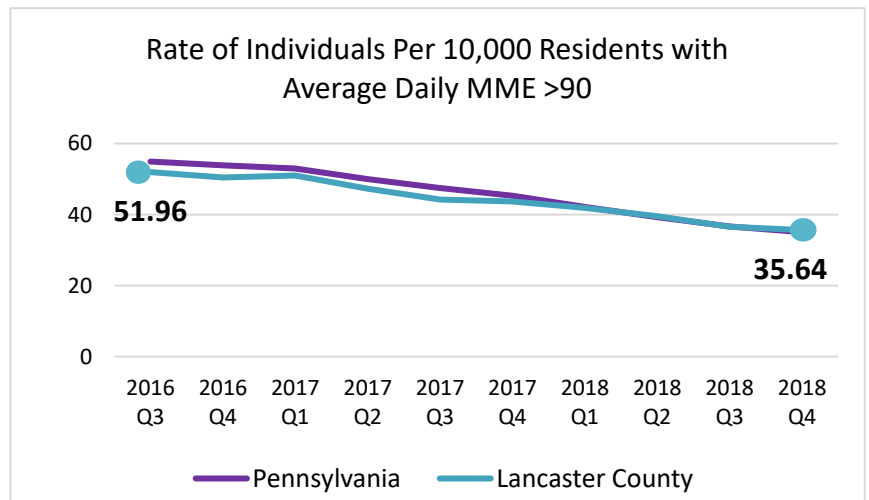
### Goal 3. Create lasting changes in the medical community that improve patient safety

4.2 Evaluate feasibility of creating a halfway house and a recovery house for women with children.

The second attempt to hire a agency to start a recovery house for women with children and a second agency to provide a halfway house for women with children did not find any qualified facilities. The next step is to determine if an existing recovery house and halfway house would convert some beds to allow women to bring their children to the facility.
